- e. Four Directions (KL): great recruitment season; enrolment is increasing; recently expanded space and open for hosting; planning for a day on campus for Indigenous students; lots of preparation for programming.
- f. LDSB(KB)spoke to their move to NBE 3 and their positive experience; kudos to the team for doing the Blanket Exercise/Activity with all administrators over the semester and into next year for other support staff; incorporation of student voice in the Blanket Exercise and contemporary impact/influence.
- g. ALCDSB (TS) spoke to their move to NBE 3 for next year
- h. ALCDSB (BR)detailed snow snake experience and partnership experience; planning for next year to repeat and improve; first sweet water and maple syrup festival this year; significant connections to curriculum
- i. LDSB (CJ) spoke student in Profile Magazine; 4th Annual Lacrosse and Friendship Day was last Friday; Indigenous Education Newsletter available (started in May)
- j. LDSB (JK) detailed the partnership with KLC; friendship and alley work in local school.
- LDSB (KM) provided details about KLC and their programs; 260 active and diverse students; 88 self-identified students – academic, integrated and cultural programming provided; detailed the Indigenous Leadership project (will share a video)
- LDSB (JK) on April 16, Molly Brant had their naming ceremony and it was a huge event; respectful of everyone who was coming and attended; mural is changing the community common area of the school and students' attention to the mural; Beyond the Classroom experience detailed; teachings happening; Parent Council will be supporting the Two Feather Walker Group on July 4.
- m. Grandmothers Council (LCJ) have a strawberry ceremony on July 6 at Richardson Beach; the Council meets 4 times a year in ceremony; presentation of Colonization Road was powerful.
- n. ALCDSB (CSD) shared their PD day experience regarding move to the NBE 3 course that was provided to staff.
- o. MOE (RM) released the revised curriculum for Indigenous Education; noted that consultation had taken place under the previous government; financial support of Indigenous Education is continuing.
- Language Nest (DSA) has a next session on June 9th in partnership with Loving Spoonful; at Skeleton Park Art Festival
- q. ATIP (DSA) a new group of students started on May 1; con-ed students start in September; graduation is next week and in Nov; they have 8 graduates who selfidentify; May 3 they had new cohort start in Manitoulin Island; they have been invited to begin a new program on James Bay in 2020.
- 5. LDSB/ALCDSB shared video of the Indigenous Leadership Gatherings and Katarokwi Educational Gathering; detailed the experiences.
