- 3. Associate Superintendent of Safe & Caring Schools Update (Scot Gillam)

a) Skills Competition - Toronto Congress Centre - May 6-8

Elementary (May 6) and Secondary (May 7 & 8) students who qualified in the Limestone Competition traveled to Toronto to compete in the Ontario Skills Competition. We had several successful results and buses of students from Grades 7-12 from a variety of schools attended the Competition on Tuesday, May 8th as part of an Experiential Learning opportunity organized by our new Experiential Learning Consultant Geoff Petznik.

b) Education Week – Mental Health Week – May 7-11, 2018

g) Promoting Youth Wellness - Parent Symposium - April 14, 2018

Keynote speaker Lynn Lyons was well received, with a lot of positive feedback. Speakers Michael Ballard and Lynda Colgan were also well received but Lynn Lyons really stole the show. Update on IEP Presentation:
