Why Has This Been Suggested to You?

Every school board in Ontario is required by Law to have a specific Special Education Plan.

The Limestone District School Board (LDSB) adheres to all Ministry of Education guidelines and regulations. This is to ensure all students have the supports they need to reach their full potential.

Parent Involvement

As a parent, you are crucial to the IPRC and Individual Education Plan (IEP) process. The information you contribute is essential in helping the school understand your child's personality, development, learning and preferences.

The Invitation

You will have received an invitation to the IPRC meeting. We encourage you to find a mutually convenient time to meet with the school Principal/Vice-Principal and other school support staff.

The Meeting

Once at the meeting, you become one of the participants. The committee revisits the strengths and areas of need for your student. The committee decides on the most appropriate identification based on assessments completed and/or a case history. The committee will also decide upon a placement for your child.

The Outcome

Once the meeting has taken place (usually about 30 minutes), an IEP is written or revised within 30 school days. This document will be updated over time as your child's assessed needs change.

Revisiting the Process

You will be invited to attend once per year. If you don't feel the IPRC review is necessary, you may waive the meeting. If you are not in agreement with the decisions of the IPRC, you may make an appeal.
