9. Self-Identification Process LDSB

a. K. Burra provided an update on the process; differentiated between formal and informal identification by students; board has examined process and are working to address identified areas of concern and barriers to self-identification. Pamphlet provided and suggestions from group provided.

10. Community Partners Update

- a. Kelly Maracle provided updates on Limestone District School Board initiatives.
- b. Molly Brant: Hosting first parent talking circle February 26, 2019.
- c. MNO: Elaine explained the make up and function of the MNO office plus positive changes occurring.
- d. St. Theresa CSS: cultural change in the school community with growth in the enrolment for n-coded courses at all grades.
- e. Kingston Police: Youth officer course had experience with the Blanket Exercise and shifting perspectives; very enriching afternoon.
- f. Deb St. Amant as the new ATEP lead. Lindsay has moved to Researcher.
 - i. Faculty of Education did the Blanket Exercise with all faculty students this year.
 - ii. Kingston Indigenous Languages Nest is working with Loving Spoonful.
- g. Sacred Heart Batawa: Provided information about Snow Snake competition and it is rescheduled on March 4 and 5, 2019 at Batawa Ski Hill.
- h. Danka Brewer: updated on her schedule and school Indigenous Knowledge programs.
 - i. Informed the committee of the death of Grandmother Josephine Mandamin and her role in Water Walks.
- i. Laurel Claus Johnson: Grandmothers meet once a year and they have just met to plan the 4 quarterly ceremonies.

11. School Board Update

a. Limestone District School Board:

- Indigenous Student Leadership Gathering will occur in partnership with ALCDSB in the spring of 2019. Additional funding application is still pending.
- ii. Gr. 11 English classes have been implemented as Indigenous Voices Course.
- iii. Requests for Knowledge Keepers is increasing across the board.

- iv. Turtle Island curriculum is being supported by 3 Professional Development sessions which include Indigenous Teachers and allies.
- v. Language Pilots at Loughborough and Perth Road schools updated.
- vi. River Program video will be shared by K. Burra in email and link.

b. Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board:

- i. Board has implemented an internal Indigenous Working group to guide the work in the board.
- ii. Indigenous Knowledge Keeper program has a roster and is fully supported so no financial requirements for schools. Roster is in constant update status and open for new additions.
- iii. Indigenous Space grants continue from last year into this school year.
- iv. Professional development has been focussed on teachers in grade 7&8 along with Itinerate Arts Teachers to indigenize the curriculum. Curriculum updates are being implemented for secondary courses.
- v. Self-identification is an ongoing challenge and requires consistent updating and support; our policy is under review.
- vi. Snow snake competition and a possible educational Pow-Wow in the spring (May 16, 2019) in partnership with the City of Kingston.

- a. Talking Circles occurring for the City of Kingston throughout the year.
- b. Timing of the meetings: regular cycle of meetings is proposed for October, January, March and May; on a Thursdays. Specific dates to be proposed later.
